

# **Pastor's Annual Report**

Last year, my Thanksgiving sermon was partly taken from Psalm 116. This psalm is considered by many theologians to be a hymn of thanksgiving. In its 12th verse, the grateful author asks an important question: "What shall I return to the Lord for all his goodness to me?" The psalm includes a three-fold answer that is a revealing as the question. 1) I will offer a toast to God for the gift of salvation. 2) I will lift up God's name and pray in the name of the Lord. 3) I'll complete what I promised God I'd do, and I'll do it together with his people. Thus, as Christians, we are called to always value the gift of salvation through Jesus' sacrifice, magnify God's holy name, and fulfill our vows to God in the presence of other people.

I am very thankful for last year. Once again, our church received an overflow of blessings from the Creator of all things visible and invisible. In 2024, our congregation embodied the love of God, the unity of the body of Christ and the joy of the Holy Spirit through concrete actions that aimed at strengthening our church and improve our surrounding community. I am personally grateful for the involvement of all members and attendees in the various activities that we had in 2024. We are not a perfect congregation. But we are certainly a congregation of people who are intentional about following Christ.

# My Pastoral Objectives for 2024

I was humbled by God's work among us last year. I believe no one should be surprised that my main pastoral objectives for 2024 were the following: 1) Continue to love our congregation with the love of Christ and offer wise and steady leadership to help our church to be true to its calling 2) work for the edification of members and regular attendees; 3) engage the town of East Lyme and the larger community; and, 4) engage our Denomination or Region. I believe that our most important Christian duty is to love God with all our heart and to love our neighbors unconditionally. My hope is that I was able to show that I was worthy of the pastoral ministry that God entrusted to me while genuinely loving all members and attendees of our church.

To contribute to the edification of our members, I have tried to show from the first days of my tenure that I genuinely value the traditions and history of this congregation. As an organizational development practitioner, I truly believe that it is almost impossible to bring about change into an organization if you don't try to understand its history and core values. As such, I met with several of you to ask you numerous questions about the history of this congregation, its identity, its people, its assets, and so forth. As some of you know, I am still asking similar questions today. Also, I was intentional about sending cards to sick and shut-ins and those of us who went through mourning because of the loss of a loved one.

I was pleased when we as a congregation decided to restart some of our traditional church sales after a hiatus due to the pandemic. Last year, our spring and year-end sales were a great success, and I am thankful to all of you who contributed to it. Last year, we also went caroling for the first time since the pandemic. We were so joyful to do this not only outdoors but also in the home of one of our shut-ins as well as in a nursing home. Some of you told me how excited you were about this event as it was reminiscent of some fantastic times that our members used to have while caroling in the past. Furthermore, while branding our Sunday school reopening as our Back-to-Church service in September, we were intentional about bringing back a breakfast that our church used to hold during that time before the pandemic. I was pleased to notice that about 115 of you attended that service. I must add that I am grateful for the level of youth involvement in various church activities last year.

Aside from bringing back some of our church's beloved traditions, we also made sure that we created new memories as well. As an example, we had a successful book signing in our basement last July. The book was about humility, and almost all participants bought a copy. The author was very pleased and told me that our attendees represented one of the most engaging audiences that he has ever had during his book signings. We also organized a classical and soulful

Christmas concert in December. That event was a tremendous success. I want to personally thank you for attending it and bringing a few guests with you. We had more than 100 people at the church that day. In addition, I thank God for being involved in various other events last year. For example, I officiated a wedding/vow renewal, led a baby dedication ceremony as well as a funeral. As we know, several members of our church went back to the Lord last year. While we mourn their passing, we also praise God for all the good things they did for their family and our church. I have a special mention for Jim Gerber who was very involved in church activities until the last few months preceding his passing. I thank God because of his wisdom that I personally experienced and for his unmatched dedication to our congregation.

To engage the community where our church is located, I made several media appearances. I have numerous conversations with several ministers who are leading churches in our town and its surroundings. I also reached out to nonprofit executives in this area. In fact, some of them came to our Christmas concert. I also invited my Baptist colleague in Niantic to help us organize the concert. One of the main tools that we used to reach out to people in our community and beyond was the livestreaming of our main services, which started in June. Thank you for all the feedback. Most of them have been overwhelmingly positive. So far, this has been a great success. We could not have done it without Mike Meinz. I also want to give a shoutout to the entire team: Penny, Debbie, David, Shawn, Ange and Andy. As you may have noticed, we have been more active on social media. Other people have noticed it as well. Some of my colleagues have been calling to learn about some "FBCC best practices"...

We also deepened our relationship with our denomination by being more involved in our regional association, SUNL. I now belong to its executive board. In fact, thanks to a grant that I wrote last year, our church received about \$2700 from SUNL in 2024. Furthermore, ABCCONN's Executive Minister, Harry Riggs attended our Christmas concert after receiving an invitation from me.

#### A few things to think about in 2025

Some of you know that I have been doing research pertaining to church decline and church development for more than 10 years. I strongly believe that the Christian Church is in an existential crisis in this country. For the first time, fewer than 50% of our fellow citizens are officially members of an organized religious organization. According to a 2018-2019 Pew Research, 65% of Americans identify as Christians. This represents a 12-percentage point decrease from a decade ago. At the same time, the unaffiliated went from 17% to 26%. Among those who call themselves Christians, less than 24% go to church on a weekly basis. If this trend continues, the US Church will be a shell of itself in the next three to five decades.

In fact, we all can see our churches decline before our very eyes. Empty pews inside beautiful church buildings are the new normal. The American Baptist Churches (ABC) are no exception to this. This denomination has also been hit by a steep decline in membership and attendance. In Connecticut, there used to be at least one American Baptist congregation in 70% of towns and cities. Today, only 30% of CT towns and cities have an ABC church. Our churches are closing and struggling. If we don't innovate and reengineer our ecclesiastical processes, more churches will close, putting in peril the very existence of this ABC region.

Thanks to the quality of pastoral and lay leadership that our congregation has had, we are in better shape than a lot of churches in this part of Connecticut. However, it is time for us to start doing strategic planning to ensure that our church is in a strong position in the next 5-10 years and beyond. We should never wait until it is too late. From my experience, it is mainly what happened to some of our ABC churches that were doing relatively well 10-20 years ago. As you know, I have executive, consulting, management and strategic planning experience. I would like to help our church go through this important process. I already mentioned that in one of our past quarterly meetings.

My proposal is to "resurrect" an important entity that is in our bylaws: the church Council. According to our bylaws, the Council is tasked to plan the future of the church. The idea is for the Council to meet regularly to rethink the future of our congregation. Once its members reach a consensus on specific ideas, they will bring them to the congregation at our quarterly meetings so a final decision can be made. There will be various ways for our congregation to be involved in this critical process.

There are also several other things that we should think about in 2025. Here are some examples:

- 1) We should think about increasing our online footprints (Instagram, Twitter, TikTok)
- 2) We should come up with an effective way to honor our guests, and encourage them to join the church
- 3) We should think about a TV ministry (local TV first) if it is free
- 4) We should start thinking about small group ministry
- 5) We must find more creative ways to reach out to our community
- 6) We should think about putting together an evangelism team
- 7) We should deepen our partnership with other churches to organize various events

Once again, thank you for a great 2024! Let us all focus on bringing the gospel to the least, the lost and the lonely in our community while encouraging each other to stay true to our faith in the Lord. May God keep blessing our church.

# **Pastor Emeritus Annual Report**

This year the Giving Garden harvested 10,876 lbs. of vegetables. Trucks from the United Way distributed the produce through Gemma Moran to the needy in New London and Norwich. 100% was donated. In a year when grocery prices have been high, and in which poor individuals tend to lack vegetables and fiber in their diet, this program has been a great success, and we can feel good about our role in it.

Troop 247, which meets in the Church basement, was a big help to us at our Christmas Sale, and also turned out to help make the large wreath which we do every year for Advent. We are grateful.

I did a number of funerals for people who were associated with us: for Debra "Debbie" Decker (Barbara Sasha's daughter), for Lois Evankow and Lee Baker, both of whom attended here in the 1960's, and for William "Willy" Kowalski, whose daughter Pam taught in our Sunday School for many years. Several Church members died this past year. We lost (in alphabetical order) Jim Gerber, Dorinda Hawkins, Myrna Lindstrom, Liz Patterson, Gail Schatz, Joe Selden, and Frank and Florence Wilson.

Jim Gerber was the Church treasurer for years, and a longtime member of the finance board. I relied on his help more times than I can remember. I mentioned at his service that we purchased the current parking area largely on the basis of his advice. Jim and I sat next to each other in the choir for years; he was a trusted and valued friend.

Dorinda Hawkins taught the youngest children Sunday School for many, many years, usually together with Marilyn Gordon. It's my job to strengthen other people's faith in God, but when I visited Dorinda, I always felt my own faithfulness strengthen; she was like that.

Myrna Lindstrom was a regular at our Wednesday night service for many years. Because that was never a large groupit varied between one and two dozen- we got to know each other well. She also was a member of the Kitchen Committee.

Liz Patterson (our oldest member at 99) also attended services and midweek services for years, and again worked hard in the Kitchen Committee, helping out at gatherings and setting up for Church sales.

Gail Schatz liked seeing who was in Church and so sat with her husband Dick in the unused choir loft on the congregation's left side. Some years back, Gail got a disc of my sermons, edited it, and paid for a selection of them to be published, for which I was and am grateful. She was, like Ruth Boyer, one of those Church members I'd known as a student back in my days at Flanders Elementary School.

Joe Selden attended regularly over the years and was a frequent participant in our Sunday morning Bible Study. When we got together, we would talk about his mother (whom I visited as a young Pastor), and about our mutual friend Joe Zizka, who had a distinguished record in the Marines in World War II and was a mentor to Joe when he began as a lobsterman.

What sunny and warm people Frank and Florence Wilson were! They began coming to Church in their senior years and quickly made a real mark on the congregation. Florence was active in the Community Circle, and Frank always had a funny or good-natured comment to make.

We look forward to helping our local families in the future.



# Web & Social Media

During 2024, there were 1,412 unique website visitors with 3,143 sessions and a total of 7,329 page views. A total of 28 emails were received via the website Contact form. The church calendar, published as a PDF on the website, was revised several times. A church directory was published after information was collected via the website. Changes to the church directory can be submitted anytime on the website. The <u>facebook.com/FlandersBaptist</u> Facebook page had 215 Followers at the beginning of 2024 and 288 Followers at the end of 2024, a 33.9% increase. This year, there was an increase in postings and followers on the Facebook page thanks to Rev. Guerrier posting many photographs with comments and purchasing ads to increase potential viewers.

In June, we started livestreaming the church services using Switcher Studio software on an iPad and two iPhones with gimbals as cameras. There were some initial problems with sound quality and Internet reliability. The sound issues appear to have been resolved after purchases of an analog-to-digital converter and an omni-directional microphone. Internet issues are still causing occasional problems. The recordings are published on the church website, Facebook and YouTube. In December, a Christmas concert was livestreamed and published. While there have been only one or two livestream viewers, recording views are in double and triple digits. Video Volunteers Penny Smyth, David Watson, Debbie Blankenship and Sean Blankenship set up and operate the equipment on alternating Sundays. Every Friday, Davilee Deal ensures that the equipment is plugged in for recharging. I troubleshoot problems, train the volunteers, keep the software versions up-to-date, continually improve the setup/operation documentation and publish the videos on the church website and Facebook.
